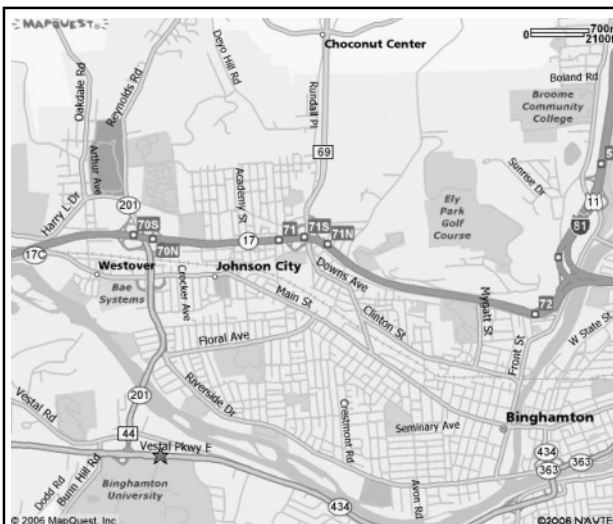

From the airport:

From the Broome County Airport, exit the main drive onto Airport Road. Go eight miles SOUTH to Rte. 17 West. Travel west on 17 to Exit 70 SOUTH. Follow Route 201 and the SUNY signs, crossing the bridge to Route 434 EAST. The main entrance to campus is your first right.

From the South

I-81 NORTH to Route 17 WEST, then take Route 17 WEST to Exit 70 SOUTH. Follow Route 201 and the SUNY signs, crossing bridge to Route 434 EAST. The main entrance to campus is your first right.

From the North

I-81 South to Route 17 WEST to Exit 70 SOUTH. Follow Route 201 and the SUNY signs, crossing bridge to Route 434 EAST. The main entrance to campus is your first right.

From the West

Follow Route 17 EAST to Exit 70 SOUTH. Follow Route 201 and the SUNY signs, crossing bridge to Route 434 EAST. The main entrance to campus is your first right.

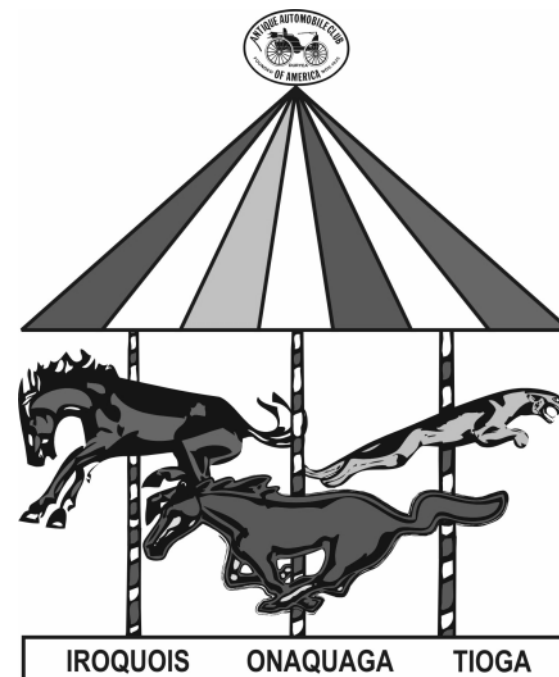

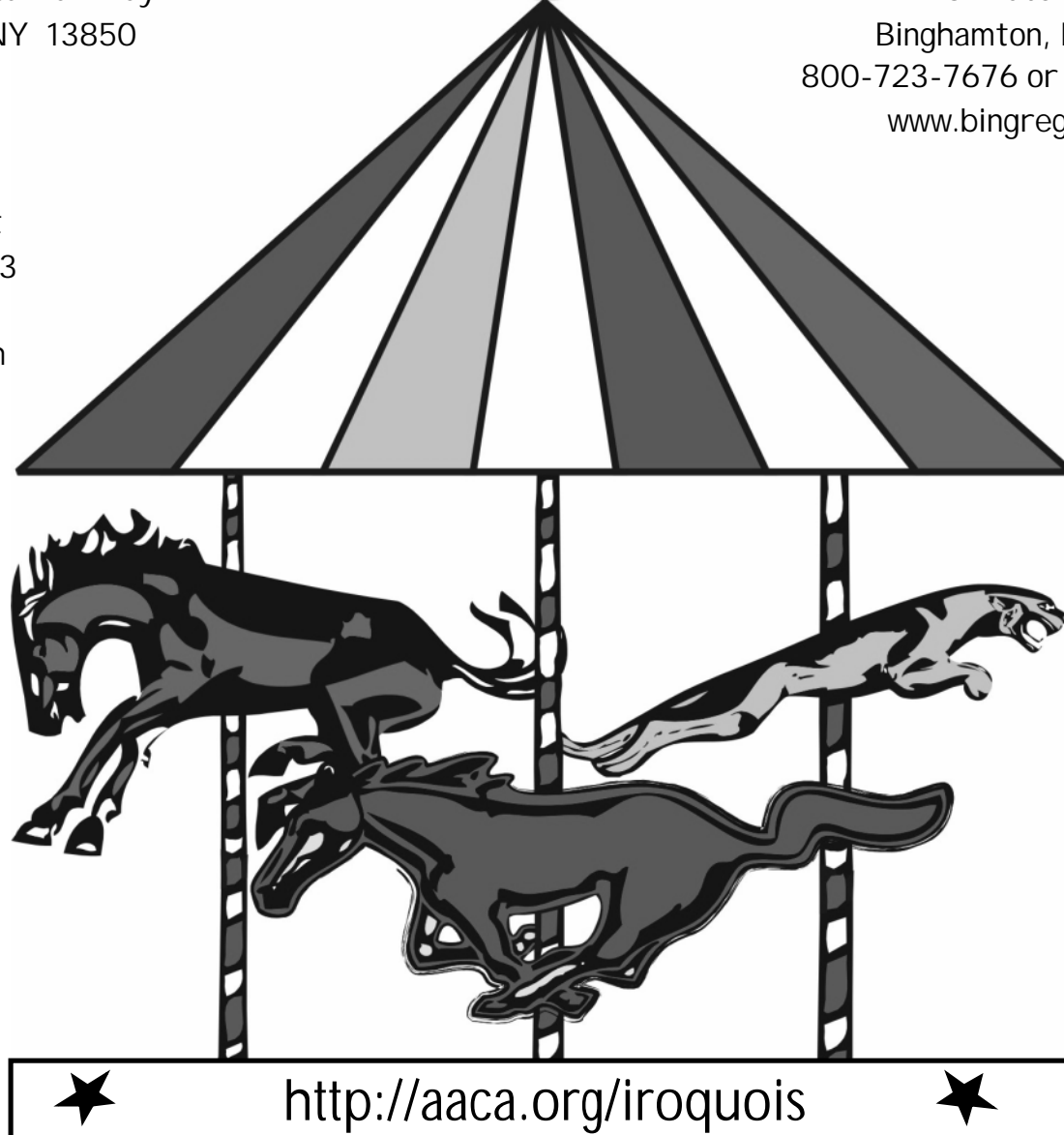

Additional information for the 2007 AACA Spring Meet in Binghamton, NY on June 28 – 30th

RV parking available after 5 pm on Friday until 11 am Sunday on the Binghamton University campus for \$30. No hook-ups available. No services provided. Must pre-register unit to get windshield pass. Unit make, model, size, license number and if you are towing a car or trailer are required for a reservation. Your confirmation and windshield pass will be mailed.

Friday night Speak Easy – directions to the secret club will be given at registration check-in. It is a 100+ year old building with ornate tin ceilings and walls with wood floors. You will sample a tasty ethnic prepared meat called speedies made with your preference of pork, chicken or lamb along with a variety of salads that go well with it. Legal (maybe even illegal) beverages will be available. You will then be entertained with the most lively music and dance from the roaring twenty's that is a rare opportunity to experience in such a historic building.

Friday Gas light parade will start at dusk.....all cars that have gas or lantern lights go first with all other cars welcome to join in the fun.
